We are delighted to celebrate a fantastic set of results for our 2022/23 GCSE pupils, with an outstanding 84% of pupils achieving 5A*- C GCSEs or equivalent for those completing 5 or more GCSEs.

Our pathway system that has been developed is a huge contributing factor to our pupils' success as it supports each pupil's individual strengths and interests.

The ongoing partnership with the Southern Regional College has provided pupils with the opportunity to undertake Occupational Studies in a range of vocational areas, with over 81% of pupils achieving A*-C grades. Our school's ability to support and encourage all pupils is further evidenced by the excellent results that our EAL pupils achieved: 71% A*-C for those completing 5 or more GCSE, or equivalent, qualifications.

City of Armagh High School is a school where every child can achieve

and the school's results continue to go from strength to strength.

POSITIVE REWARD HOUSE SYSTEM

In City of Armagh High School great emphasis is placed on promoting positive behaviour. We encourage our pupils to develop good habits and to build a positive attitude towards learning. Each pupil belongs to a house and can earn house points for their house. Our pupils are regularly rewarded for their hard work and good behaviour.

We run a weekly reward system where the top 10 pupils in each year group are given a small token to say 'well done, keep up the great work' and a text is sent home to the parents. Each month the top 2 pupils in each form group are rewarded with a prize and a certificate. This year our Pupils of the Month have received Apache Pizza vouchers so that they can treat themselves for all their hard work.

Empowerment CURRICULUM

The Learning Support Centre/ Autism Specific Centre meets the needs of pupils with a Statement of Special Educational Needs for Moderate Learning Difficulties and/or a diagnosis of ASD. Access to the Northern Ireland Curriculum is at a level suited to each pupil's age, ability and aptitude.

The classes are currently staffed by six teachers and nine classroom assistants. A warm, supportive and hard-working atmosphere has been established in the setting, facilitating increased pupil confidence. Pupils are provided with suitable opportunities to integrate with the mainstream school in classes appropriate to their ability levels. All pupils have access to classroom assistants.

In Years 11, 12 and 13 all pupils have the opportunity to undertake accredited external exams, including link courses in the Armagh Campus of Southern Regional College.
