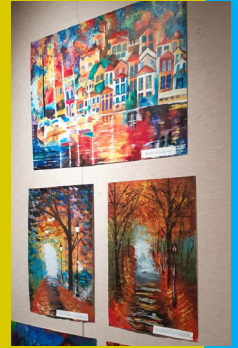




## GCSE Art Exhibition

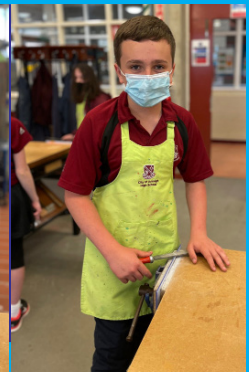
This year, the paints came out, digital things happened, and new artists were explored; despite COVID the pupils allowed creativity to flow and there were certainly smiles under those masks!
